Local punk ruins her life and reputation at pro-life slumber party

Taffety Punk lays bare the tragicomedy in the world of a pro-life teen

MOM BABY GOD

Grab a cupcake, put on a name tag, and prepare to be thrown into the world of the Christian right, where **sexual purity workshops** and anti-abortion rallies are sandwiched between karaoke sing-alongs, Christian EDM raves, and pro-life slumber parties. After years of immersive research and workshops, playwright and actor **Madeline Joey Rose** launches a fully revamped version of *MOM BABY GOD* — her controversial solo show that brings the audience face-to-face with American girl culture in the right-wing.

It's 2020 and the anti-abortion movement has a new sense of urgency. Teens 4 Life is live on Instagram from the Students for Life of America Conference, and right-wing teenagers are vying for popularity while preparing for political battle. Our tour guide is fourteen-year-old Destinee Grace Ramsey. Destinee ascends to prominence as the new It-Girl of the Christian right while struggling to contain her crush on John Paul, a flirtatious Christian boy with blossoming YouTube stardom and a purity ring. While Rose delivers authentic context—setting the play deep inside the right-wing's youth training ground—Destinee's struggle is the heart of the story. Rose describes this story as "coming of age and discovering your sexuality in a world that teaches you to fight those instincts and to find shame in them."

The play has been a labor of love for Rose, who has toured previous versions to sold-out houses, while enduring a national right-wing smear campaign. Teaming up with Taffety Punk to revise and refine her script, Rose says, "I've always seen *MOM BABY GOD* as a form of **punk theatre**. It's immersive and unapologetic and defies easy categorization. Taffety Punk's work has always resonated with me as bold and risk-embracing and imaginative."

Director **Lise Bruneau**, company member and **co-founder** of Taffety Punk, says, "Madeline has very intelligently taken a subject with a great deal of controversy around it and delivers, often verbatim, content that pro-lifers use. Comment-free. The audience is able to come to their own conclusions about what that might mean or what impact that could have."

Asked what has changed in the pro-life movement since she began this work five years ago, Rose half-jokes that Justin Bieber has changed, which has made necessary changes in the script—Destinee is a Belieber. She also describes a surprising surge in the movement for establishing social relevance. "Especially in the past few years, the pro-life involvement in social media has expanded dramatically. The ways they adopt and manipulate left-wing rhetoric also strikes me. The whole spin recently has been about how they, the anti-abortion movement, is the true feminist movement. There was even a contingent of teenage boys at the March for Life this year wearing pink hats like at the Women's March...but with crosses on the sides of the hats."

For Bruneau, the play is important on the most fundamental level of compassion. She says, "The right to choose is one of the most complex issues that we face as a country and one where people are passionate on both sides. I feel that all of us could use a great deal more information about what people are hearing on both sides."

Madeline Joey Rose is a rising star in Washington DC, and Taffety Punk was drawn to work with her after encountering her other projects in theatre and music. She is an actor who arrived in town already embracing and practicing Taffety Punk's multi-discipline aesthetic. Bruneau speaks highly of her after a rehearsal: "Having one woman play a multitude of characters that are often talking to each other, we are tasked with making sure the story is clear; and we are able to do that in very surprising ways due to Madeline's incredible facility as an actor."

Bruneau warns Taffety Punk's largely left-wing fans, "The audience may find themselves agreeing with many of the propositions that the movement puts forward."

MOM BABY GOD occupies a **limited run** at the Capitol Hill Arts Workshop (545 7th Street SE, Washington, DC 20003). There will be a single pay-what-you-can performance on March 2 at 8:00pm. The show opens on March 3, at 8pm and runs for another five performances through March 10; March 5, 7, 8, at 7:30pm and March 9, 10 at 8:00pm. Lise Bruneau (Director) has been a professional actor and director for over 25 years, having arrived in DC via St. Louis, the Bay Area, London, and NYC. A founding member of the Taffety Punks, Lise has helmed their Riot Grrrl productions of The Tempest, Titus Andronicus, Julius Caesar, Measure for Measure and Romeo and Juliet; the Bootleg Shakespeares: Loves Labours Lost, Pericles, The Two Noble Kinsmen, Troilus and Cressida, Cymbeline and Henry the VIII; thrilling plays Oxygen and Bloody Poetry; World Premieres of Inheritance Canyon, Owl Moon, Let X, and The Devil in his Own Words; and for the Arena Stage writer's festivals staged readings of Toys in the Attic and Tiny Alice. Regional directing credits include 4000 Miles at Clarence Brown Theatre, Savage in Limbo for MetroStage, and Hamlet for the Nebraska Shakespeare Festival among others. As an actor, Lise has appeared at the Roundabout on Broadway in The Cherry Orchard.
